Land Operations Expansion

To keep up with our growing herd, we're always looking to add properties to our land operations. Over the last 24 months, we've added 590 key acres in IN and MI to support the herd at the Sawyer, MI headquarters (160 acres). For the newer properties, we leveraged multiple grasses and legumes to create quality forage requiring minimal inputs.
